



ROCKWALL CYBER PATRIOT



Now in its sixth phase, Cyber Patriot is open to all high schools, accredited home school programs, as well as Civil Air Patrol, Naval Sea Cadet Corps, and Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps units across the country.

Cyber Patriot is the premier National High School Cyber Defense Competition created to inspire high school students toward careers in cyber security or other science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) disciplines critical to our nation's future. The competition was conceived by the Air Force Association and is presented by the Northrop Grumman Foundation.

The first Cyber Patriot season consisted of one round of in-person competition at the Air Force Association's 25th Air Warfare Symposium in Orlando, Florida. Eight total teams from the Orlando area competed, seven AFJROTC and one CAP. Competitors used SAIC's CyberNEXS program to find vulnerabilities and harden the defense of a Windows system. After the two-day event, the inaugural Cyber Patriot National Finals Championship was bestowed upon the Osceola High School Air Force JROTC team.


Cyber Patriot VI is just beginning, but with a registration goal of 3000 teams, it is already shaping up to be the biggest, most exciting competition season yet. Boy Scout troops and Boys and Girls Clubs will be able to field teams. Linux and Windows images will both be used with CCS

v2.0, and CyberNEXS will power the all-new Regional Recognition Round. With more teams, more awards, more challenges, and more fun, now is the time to register for the biggest game of the year.

We are ecstatic to have Todd Manning leading as our Coach for two teams in Rockwall, Texas; one at Rockwall and one at Rockwall-Heath High Schools. Manning is working with teachers Bruce Charbonneau and Jennifer McDermott in conjunction with Jean Laswell, Career-Technical Education Coordinator for the Rockwall ISD.

Manning, Charbonneau and McDermott are leading two teams of students, about 12 students to date and are taking on the new challenge of joining the competition. We in Chapter 416 could not be prouder to be supporting in small ways at this time.

We are in need of additional coaches and mentors. We want to stress, no experience is required, just

THE EAST TEXAS WAR AND MEMORY PROJECT

Chapter 416 donated \$1000 to this noble and worthy work

The East Texas War and Memory Project is an oral and public history project designed to collect and preserve the stories of military veterans and their family members in order to examine the realities of war and its effects beyond the popular images of Hollywood and media.

- *Celebrate and honor the sacrifices of men and women who served their country.*
- *Facilitate the study of war and memory in order to examine the creation, re-creation, and shaping of individual and collective memory.*
- *Create a dialogue between veterans and students in order to shape attitudes and philosophies of the leaders of tomorrow.*
- *Celebrate and honor the sacrifices of men and women who served their country.*

The East Texas War and Memory Project also collects and preserves photographs, documents, and other written records to complement and enhance an individual's story. Some veterans and their families donate items to the ETWMP, including photographs, family letters, military papers, while other veterans allow us to digitally scan materials for the Archives. The images are then uploaded to the Digital Collections to facilitate examination by students, scholars, and family members.

Students and faculty from a variety of academic disciplines transcribe the oral histories and then produce contextualized narratives for presentation and publication. Thus far, we have presented papers at conferences of the East Texas Historical Association, the Southwest Popular Culture Conference, and the Texas Oral History Association.

TEXAS STATE MEETING

The 2013 Summer Texoma Region Quarterly Conference was held in Wichita Falls on the 2nd and 3rd of August. The Donnelly Chapter hosted the event at the at the Holiday Inn (At The Falls).

Trey Johnson, Chapter Presidesnt, attended the meeting to represent and be a voice for the chapter.

The conference began with a golf outing on Friday morning with a round of golf at the Wind Creek course.

Later that afternoon the attendees were treated to a tour of the new Call Field World War I Museum at the Kickapoo Downtown Airport near Sheppard AFB.

Taylor reminded the members that wounded airmen do not receive the same level of attention that marines and army soldiers do. For that reason, the AFA needs to develop resources to support wounded airmen and promote this idea throughout the organization and the general public.

Garland encouraged attendees to sign up for the upcoming national convention.

Region President Bob Slaughter, State President, Bob Lawson, and State Secretary, Joan Lopez, gave brief speeches emphasizing a more positive outlook for the chapters, donations to the Tinker AFB tornado victims fund and the need to file chapter paperwork on time.

In addition, David Warner, retired brigadier general and candidate for At-Large Director took time on his way to San Antonio to speak to the

conference about his qualifications.

At the dinner held that evening, the conference was honored to have guest speaker Lt. General Bruce Litchfield, Commander of the Air Force Sustainment Center at Tinker AFB. He spoke on the logistical challenges faced by the Air Force as a result of the reduced DoD budget.

General Litchfield stayed after his speech to present awards during the ceremony which followed. The Northeast Texas Chapter scored four of the awards, two of which were Medal of Freedom recipients Joe Gauthier and Mark Bushnell.

The highlight of the awards ceremony was the presentation of the Texas Teacher of the Year Award to our own Marcy Whited. Moreover, General Litchfield specifically singled out Marcy during his speech.

The conference was an outstanding display of patriotism and dedication to service that represents the Air Force Association at its best.
